Developed by fire service personnel and families who have lost a firefighter in the line of duty, the class covers pre-incident planning, survivor notification, family and co-worker support, and benefits and resources available to the families. You'll go home with specific ideas, practical information, real-world insights, and valuable materials.

Instructors for this class are Retired Chief Ron Blackwell, who served several fire departments in Maryland and Kansas; Angie Moreland, Ph.D., director of the Center for Firefighter Behavioral Health; Cathy Hedrick, mother of a fallen firefighter; and Ian Bennett, coordinator of the national Local Assistance State Team program for the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation.

This one-day seminar for chiefs and chaplains is FREE, and includes lunch.
